The ICWDR really has become the most spectacular gathering of wooden dinghies that can be found out on the water in Australia, the regatta has even drawn attention from overseas with international magazines, blogs and webpages reporting on the event. No small feat. Continual and growing support for the event has come from many places, including local community groups such as Lions and Rotary, our greatly appreciated business sponsors, the Bass Coast Shire Council, the community in general and of course the South Gippsland Yacht Club itself. Each year we are overwhelmed with the commitment of regatta participants, many travelling from interstate to be part of the weekends' enthusiastic atmosphere. This upcoming year will be the sixth of the annual regatta and we expect another large turnout.

In previous regatta years we've celebrated different elements of interest, last year it was the much loved Moths 90th birthday. This year we're making a big nod to Jack Holt. Holt boats were and still are incredibly influential on the shape of sailing, with such popular family dinghies as the Heron, Mirror (the history of the Mirrors conception is an interesting story of collaboration), Miracle, GP14 and Cadet. We're putting out the call, if you have a Jack Holt design, now's the time to dust it off!!! Regardless of condition, we want to see you out on the waters of Anderson's Inlet alongside all the other lovely woodies. There is also an opportunity for those that may not want to get wet, to display your dinghy in the town hall for the long weekend as part of the Jack Holt Display.

*The "wet your sails" and "dry your sails" supervised sailing time are open to change dependent on weather etc, they may be a formal race, picnic sail, social sail or treasure hunt.

Sunday night will see a more formal Regatta Dinner with presentations.
