



## South Gippsland Yacht Club Sail School

The SGYC Sailing School presents an Introduction to Off the Beach Sailing course. The course aims to allow participants to learn and develop the fundamental skills of Sailing. The Sailing School will include lots of one-on-one coaching in boats, on-shore demonstrations and theory sessions.

Students are encouraged to follow up the course with ongoing sailing so as to practise and reinforce the skills introduced. Dinghies are available for use by club members on club sailing days.

**Duration:** 12 hours over 2 days

### **Pre-requisites**

Water confident, ability to swim 25m in open water, ability to tread-water. Physically able.

### **Course Outline**

The course will introduce the beginning sailor to:

#### **Prepare and Plan**

Select clothing and safety equipment suitable to the conditions

Recall safe sailing practices.

#### **Rigging**

Identify parts of the boat, rigging and sails

Rig boat with assistance

Pack-up after sailing

#### **Rope work**

Be able to tie figure of eight, sheet bend, bowline and reef knots. Heave and Stowe Line and rope.

#### **Winds, tides and currents**

Identify gusts and lulls

Identify wind direction, relative strength and environmental conditions

Recognise tides and Sea state conditions

#### **Launching and Recovery**

Demonstrate care of boats when launching. Leaving and returning to a beach / launching facility

#### **Sailing Techniques and Manoeuvres**

Recall the points of sail.

Correct positioning of the boat relative to wind direction

Steering and crewing.

Primary boat controls and basic heave-to.

Sail a triangular course.

#### **Rescue Procedures and Drills**

Capsize and Recovery a sailing dinghy.

Being Towed behind a support boat

#### **Sailing Theory and Background**

State the basic rules of sailing. Giving way, Starboard over Port Tack, Mark rounding.

Avoiding Collisions –lookout and awareness of on water boats and obstacles.

Power and sail meeting in a channel, exceptions - commercial vessels.
